REGULAR BOARD MEETING
SEPTEMBER 10, 2025**

A. CALL TO ORDER

District Manager Nancy Nguyen called the September 10, 2025, Regular Board Meeting of the Islands at Doral (SW) Community Development District (the “District”) to order at 6:31 p.m. in the Doral Legacy Park Second Floor Conference Room located at 11400 NW 82nd Terrace, Doral, Florida 33178.

B. PROOF OF PUBLICATION

Ms. Nguyen presented proof of publication that notice of the Regular Board Meeting had been published in the *Miami Herald* on September 20, 2024, as part of the District’s Fiscal Year 2024/2025 Regular Meeting Schedule, as legally required.

C. ESTABLISH A QUORUM

Ms. Nguyen determined that the attendance of Chairman Jairo Zapata, Vice Chairwoman Elizabeth Canchola, and Supervisors Oscar De Cardenas and Delia Arcelus (who arrived at approximately 6:50 p.m.), constituted a quorum and it was in order to proceed with the meeting.

Staff in attendance included: District Manager Nancy Nguyen of Special District Services, Inc.; and General Counsel Scott Cochran of Billing, Cochran, Lyles, Mauro & Ramsey, P.A.

D. ADDITIONS OR DELETIONS TO THE AGENDA

There were no other additions or deletions to the agenda.

E. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC FOR ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA

There were no comments from the public for items not on the agenda.

F. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

1. June 11, 2025, Regular Board Meeting & Public Hearing

Ms. Nguyen presented the minutes of the June 11, 2025, Regular Board Meeting and Public Hearing and asked if there were any changes.

There being no changes, a **motion** was made by Mr. De Cardenas, seconded by Mr. Zapata and unanimously passed approving the minutes of the June 11, 2025, Regular Board Meeting and Public Hearing, as presented.

G. OLD BUSINESS

1. Update Regarding Roadway Repairs and Restriping (Polynesian Subdivision)

Ms. Nguyen informed the Board that the roadway repairs and restriping of the Polynesian subdivision District owned roads has been completed.

H. NEW BUSINESS

1. Consider Resolution No. 2025-06 – Adopting a Fiscal Year 2024/2025 Amended Budget

Ms. Nguyen presented Resolution No. 2025-06, entitled:

RESOLUTION NO. 2025-06

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE ISLANDS AT DORAL (SW) COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT AUTHORIZING AND ADOPTING AN AMENDED FINAL FISCAL YEAR 2024/2025 BUDGET (“AMENDED BUDGET”), PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 189, FLORIDA STATUTES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Ms. Nguyen provided an explanation for the document. She indicated that there was an operating fund balance of approximately \$445,000 at the end of the fiscal year. A discussion ensued after which:

A motion was made by Mr. Zapata, seconded by Ms. Canchola and unanimously passed to adopt Resolution No. 2025-06, as presented, thereby setting the amended/revised budget for the 2024/2025 fiscal year.

2. Consider Resolution No. 2025-07 – Goals and Objectives Annual Report

Ms. Nguyen presented Resolution No. 2025-07, entitled:

RESOLUTION 2025-07

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE ISLANDS AT DORAL (SW) COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT ADOPTING AN ANNUAL REPORT OF GOALS, OBJECTIVES, AND PERFORMANCE MEASURES AND STANDARDS; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Ms. Nguyen read the resolution into the record and explained that pursuant to legislation enacted in 2024, effective October 1, 2024, the District is required to establish goals and objectives for the District and to adopt performance measures and standards to evaluate the District’s achievement of these goals and objectives. She further noted that at the conclusion of each fiscal year, the Board must review and determine whether such goals have been met.

Ms. Nguyen presented the goals and objectives adopted by the District in 2024 and advised that it was in order for the Board to determine if the goals were met. Following discussion, the Board determined that all goals had been successfully achieved for fiscal year 2024/2025.

A **motion** was made by Mr. De Cardenas, seconded by Ms. Canchola and unanimously passed accepting Resolution No. 2025-07, as presented, further adopting the Islands at Doral (SW) Community Development District’s Goals and Objectives Annual Report.

3. Consider Resolution No. 2025-08 – Interlocal Agreement for Local Government Publications

Ms. Nguyen presented Resolution No. 2025-08, entitled:

RESOLUTION 2025-08

A RESOLUTION OF THE ISLANDS AT DORAL (SW) COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT (THE "DISTRICT") RELATING TO THE INTERLOCAL ACCESS AGREEMENT FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT PUBLICATION OF LEGAL ADVERTISEMENTS AND PUBLIC NOTICES ON COUNTY DESIGNATED WEBSITE; APPROVING SAME; PROVIDING FOR AUTHORIZED SIGNATORIES; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

Ms. Nguyen explained that she would like to discuss the District's required publications, and the costs associated with them. Ms. Nguyen stated that due to the closing of the Miami Daily Business Review, the District has had to advertise in The Miami Herald. Ms. Nguyen further explained that a standard publication costs approximately \$800 with The Miami Herald. She further explained that this prompted her office to seek an alternative option for publications. Ms. Nguyen noted that it has been determined that advertising on Miami-Dade County's (the "County") website meets Florida Statute requirements and the County's attorney has authorized entering into an Interlocal Agreement (the "ILA") with community development districts to allow them to advertise on the County's website. She further noted that the cost to advertise on the County's website for an unlimited amount of advertisements per year is \$707. Mr. Cochran explained that the District will need to publish an initial advertisement in the Miami Herald annually notifying the public of its intent to advertise on the County's website for the next year. Ms. Nguyen noted that this will still result in costs savings for the District.

Ms. Nguyen explained that this resolution authorizes Nancy Nguyen as District Manager, Jairo Zapata as Chairman, and Elizabeth Canchola as Vice Chairwoman, to execute the ILA and any other documents related to the ILA.

A **motion** was made by Mr. Zapata, seconded by Mr. De Cardenas and unanimously passed to approve and adopt Resolution No. 2025-08; thereby authorizing Nancy Nguyen as District Manager, Jairo Zapata as Chairman, and Elizabeth Canchola as Vice Chairwoman, to execute the Interlocal Agreement for government publication of legal advertisements and public notices and any other documents related to the Interlocal Agreement.

4. 2025 Legislative Update Memo (BCLMR)

Mr. Cochran explained that his firm annually prepares a memorandum summarizing the legislative acts that have become law during the most recent legislative session. Mr. Cochran provided the Board an explanation of the laws that pertain to the District. He further informed the Board that if they have any questions regarding these new laws, they may contact his office or the District Manager.

I. ADMINISTRATIVE & OPERATIONAL MATTERS

1. Reminder: Required Ethics Training

Mr. Cochran reminded the Board members of the importance of completing their 4-hour ethics training annually by December 1st.

The Board asked Ms. Nguyen to email the Board the links prepared by District Counsel to the ethics training videos. Ms. Nguyen acknowledged the Board's request.

J. BOARD MEMBER & STAFF CLOSING COMMENTS

Ms. Nguyen stated that unless an emergency were to arise, the Board would not need to meet until November 11, 2025.

NOTE: Ms. Arcelus arrived at approximately 6:50 p.m.

There were no further comments from Board Members or District Staff.

K. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the Board, a **motion** was made by Ms. Canchola, seconded by Mr. Zapata and unanimously passed adjourning the Regular Board Meeting at 6:51 p.m.


- Attorneys/Partners: \$300.00 per hour
